Engineering

NC State and UNC Asheville jointly offer Mechatronics Engineering with all years completed in Asheville. The 2+2 Engineering program is also offered jointly by NC State and UNC Asheville with disciplines that include Computer Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Environmental Engineering, and more. Two years are completed at UNCA and two years at NCSU.

Music Technology

The music department has a key partnership with Bob Moog Electronic Music Studio playing an important role in developing talent for music industry growth in the area. The music industry was estimated to contribute \$383M in total output and supported nearly 3,400 jobs in Buncombe county in 2016.

WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY

Also part of the UNC System, Western Carolina University (WCU) offers 115 undergraduate majors and 40 graduate degree and certificate programs.

Nursing

Western Carolina University's Bachelor of Science in nursing prelicensure program is ranked first in the state by the Nursing Schools Almanac research team, in part for achieving an almost perfect rate of graduates passing the National Council Licensure Examination, on their first attempt. Additionally, WCU offers several highly ranked nursing degrees at the Master's and Doctoral levels in Asheville and online.



SELECT ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Engineering

The Bachelor of Science in Engineering program provides traditional engineering curriculum with extensive hands-on laboratory and real world experience. Concentrations include Electrical Power, Manufacturing, and Mechanical. The College of Engineering and Technology also partners with businesses, industry and entrepreneurs to develop new products and processes through The Rapid Center, the in-house research and development center.

Data Science

The Graduate Certificate in Data Science is designed for the part-time student who wants to improve their skills in managing, visualizing and modeling with data. The stand-alone certificate program is located at the main campus and the instructional site at Biltmore Park-Asheville.

Business Administration

WCU's Business Administration Program is home to the nationally renowned Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation, as well as the Master of Project Management and MBA programs, which are fully accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), an international organization.



MOUNTAIN AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTER (MAHEC)

Serving Western North Carolina since

1974

Mountain Area Health Education Center (MAHEC) was established in 1974 to improve training and retention of healthcare professionals across Western North Carolina (WNC). Located in Asheville, MAHEC serves North Carolina's 16 westernmost counties and is the largest of the nine state AHECs.



In 2018, MAHEC contributed \$93.5M to the WNC economy and supported 1,000 jobs.

HEALTH PROFESSIONS TRAINING & EDUCATION

Residency & Fellowship Programs

MAHEC trains the next generation of healthcare professionals for Western North Carolina through residency and fellowship programs in addiction, critical care, dentistry, family medicine, general surgery, internal medicine, maternal-fetal medicine, ob/gyn, rural health, psychiatry, pharmacotherapy, and sports medicine.

Last year, MAHEC trained 154 dentists, pharmacists and physicians. By 2023, that number will increase to over 200 with new and expanded GME programs.

Student Education

MAHEC's Center for Health Professions Education provides opportunities that inspire and prepare students to pursue healthcare careers in WNC. Programs span high school through undergraduate, postgraduate, and medical school to create a pipeline of welltrained healthcare professionals for WNC. an underserved region.

Last year, MAHEC provided 453,825 hours of clinical training to NC health science students

Continuing Professional Development

UNC Health Sciences at MAHEC's Department of Continuing Professional Development conducts programs designed to meet the education and training needs of health and human service professionals in allied health, dental health, medicine, mental health, nursing and pharmacotherapy.

In 2021, MAHEC provided 1,061 continuing education programs to more than 22,632 participants in a variety of health professions from across WNC and the nation.

Asheville Area educators and business leaders collaborate to better engage young people in their learning. Teachers and leaders recognize the importance of equipping young students with the skills for success in a globalized era.

Students in middle and high schools build critical thinking and problemsolving techniques through hands-on learning and an innovative curriculum that emphasize Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) topics.



STEM School Programs

Buncombe County Schools opened the Nesbitt Discovery Academy in 2014 to provide opportunities for students to engage in innovative STEM curriculum. Asheville City's School of Inquiry and Life Sciences at Asheville (SILSA) is the #1 high school in the Asheville Metro (U.S. News & World Report, 2021) and offers curriculum with a life science theme.



At Buncombe County Schools our mission statement echoes the state's focus on preparing students to be 'Career and College Ready,' and we count on our community partners to help us in that endeavor. The experiences our students have can lead to a job right out of high school, with the impetus to secure further education for career advancement.

Career and Technical Education

The mission of CTE is to offer dynamic 21st century programs to students based on the 16 national career clusters that align with the business and industry sectors in our area.

Both Asheville City and Buncombe County Schools provide **Career and Technical Education (CTE)** to prepare students for future careers and higher education. CTE provides students a way to earn college credits and credentials sought by local industries and businesses. The CTE curriculum also develops life and soft skills such as decision-making, communication, critical thinking, creative thinking, problem solving, leadership, and more.
