
SELECT ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Engineering

NC State and UNC Asheville jointly offer Mechatronics Engineering with all years completed in Asheville. The 2+2 Engineering program is also offered jointly by NC State and UNC Asheville with disciplines that include Computer Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Environmental Engineering, and more. Two years are completed at UNCA and two years at NCSU.

Music Technology

The music department has a key partnership with Bob Moog Electronic Music Studio playing an important role in developing talent for music industry growth in the area. The music industry was estimated to contribute \$244M in total output and supported over 930 jobs in Buncombe county in 2022.



Nursing

Western Carolina University's Bachelor of Science in nursing prelicensure program is ranked first in the state by the Nursing Schools Almanac research team, in part for achieving an almost perfect rate of graduates passing the National Council Licensure Examination, on their first attempt. Additionally, WCU offers several highly ranked nursing degrees at the Master's and Doctoral levels in Asheville and online.

Engineering

The Bachelor of Science in Engineering program provides traditional engineering curriculum with extensive hands-on laboratory and real world experience. Concentrations include Electrical Power, Manufacturing, and Mechanical. The College of Engineering and Technology also partners with businesses, industry and entrepreneurs to develop new products and processes through The Rapid Center, the in-house research and development center.

Data Science

The Graduate Certificate in Data Science is designed for the part-time student who wants to improve their skills in managing, visualizing and modeling with data. The stand-alone certificate program is located at the main campus and the instructional site at Biltmore Park-Asheville.

Business Administration

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HEALTH PROFESSIONS TRAINING & EDUCATION

Residency & Fellowship Programs

MAHEC trains the next generation of healthcare professionals for Western North Carolina through residency and fellowship programs in addiction, critical care, dentistry, family medicine, general surgery, internal medicine, maternal-fetal medicine, ob/gyn, rural health, psychiatry, pharmacotherapy, and sports medicine.

Student Education

MAHEC's Center for Health Professions Education provides opportunities that inspire and prepare students to pursue healthcare careers in WNC. Programs span high school through undergraduate, postgraduate, and medical school to create a pipeline of welltrained healthcare professionals for WNC, an underserved region. As of June 2023, more than 700 physicians and dentists have graduated from MAHEC.

Continuing Professional Development

UNC Health Sciences at MAHEC's Department of Continuing Professional Development conducts programs designed to meet the education and training needs of health and human service professionals in allied health, dental health, medicine, mental health, nursing and pharmacotherapy.

In 2023, MAHEC provided more than 700 continuing education programs to 100,000 participants in a variety of health professions from across WNC and the nation.
